Staff Reports:

- **Golf Operations – Darryl**
 - **Special Recognition**
 - Golf Now has been a part of the POA marketing plan for 4 years. It is targeted at attracting non-member golfers. We see the impact of this in the consistent growth of non-member golf rounds. Golf Now consistently sends out surveys to their customers to evaluate their golf experiences.
 - The Highlands Golf Course is now rated as the #4 course in the state of Arkansas and Dogwood is rated as #5. The POA is in the semi-private group.
 - Darryl recognized the leadership teams from both courses for their outstanding dedication to customer satisfaction: Highlands Superintendent Greg Jones, Head Golf Pro Alex Sanford, Dogwood Superintendent Scott Hanson and Metfield Golf Supervisor Paul Gomez. CONGRATULATIONS!!
 - **Golf rounds**
 - Golf rounds and revenue for the year have not been finalized yet and will be presented at the February meeting.
 - **Increasing Member Rounds Challenge**
 - The Committee has been challenged to suggest ideas on how to improve Member Rounds as part of the monthly Challenge topic. We will discuss in February
 - **World Handicapping System**
 - The new World Handicapping System is being rolled out. This includes a number of changes in the software algorithms that calculate the handicap including 8 or most 20 rounds rather than 10, and a daily adjustment for play results.
 - We will stay with our current system. It is in the process of being updated now and is expected to be fully operational in the next few months. Darryl will keep group leaders informed of the progress.

- The \$6 per player cost will remain the same.
- There are excellent articles about the World Handicapping System available on the USGA website.
- **Other topics**
 - Reflective tape will be attached to the flags at Dogwood to test adhesive and assistance in helping range finders spot the flag.
 - The 2020 POA Tournament schedule is nearing completion. The schedule and registration forms will be posted near the end of February.
 - The software for the simulator is on hold. The pros use the simulator for fittings and occasionally members use it when the weather is bad.
- **Maintenance – Keith**
 - **Scottsdale Update (Keith & Darryl)**
 - On January 7th, a tour was conducted to review the detour plans and inspect the bridge damage on #2 of Scottsdale. About 15 people attended.
 - Crafton and Tull have started the permitting and startup work. Startup includes the survey, Roadway Engineering and Erosion Control Plans and letting of construction contracts. Permitting may be needed for ADEQ, City of Bella Vista and The Fish & Wildlife Department related to stream impact. Federal permits are already in place. Overall the permitting requirements appear to be minimal.
 - Once the construction drawings are ready, we will determine if work can be done in-house by the MAC Department. If not, we will solicit bids from external contractors per POA policies.
 - A tee area for gold tees will be marked on the revised #8 teeing area.
 - Overall completion is targeted at late May. We will work on the bridge at #2 first, then finish the stabilization work on #4.
 - **General Maintenance**
 - This season we are working with smaller crews and a tighter budget. Courses will be on a 2-week rotation of closure for winter projects.
 - The teams are working to spray pre-emergent to help reduce the number of weeds
 - We will use occasional burn piles for miscellaneous natural debris. The fire department approves all burn days and the fires are extinguished every day. Due to the storm debris cleanup, we have limited amounts of debris to dispose of.
 - This winter the crews will be doing winter projects such as tree pruning and stump grinding.
 - **Disaster Cleanup**
 - We will be testing the feasibility of burying the large stumps remaining from the wind event last year. We will start on Berksdale, and if the process is successful, move on to the other courses.
 - There is a possibility of picking up the stumps, however the location and difficulty in getting heavy equipment to the area poses a challenge, so this will be used sparingly.

Final

- The Assessment Vote is underway. As of January 7th, we are 43.6% of quorum. A call campaign is planned through next week. We need 50% of eligible votes to meet the quorum. We are slightly ahead of the previous vote.

Keith - once the grass starts growing again in April, we will take the broom out and brush the rocks off. If it is done now, it would damage the grass, so it is best to wait.

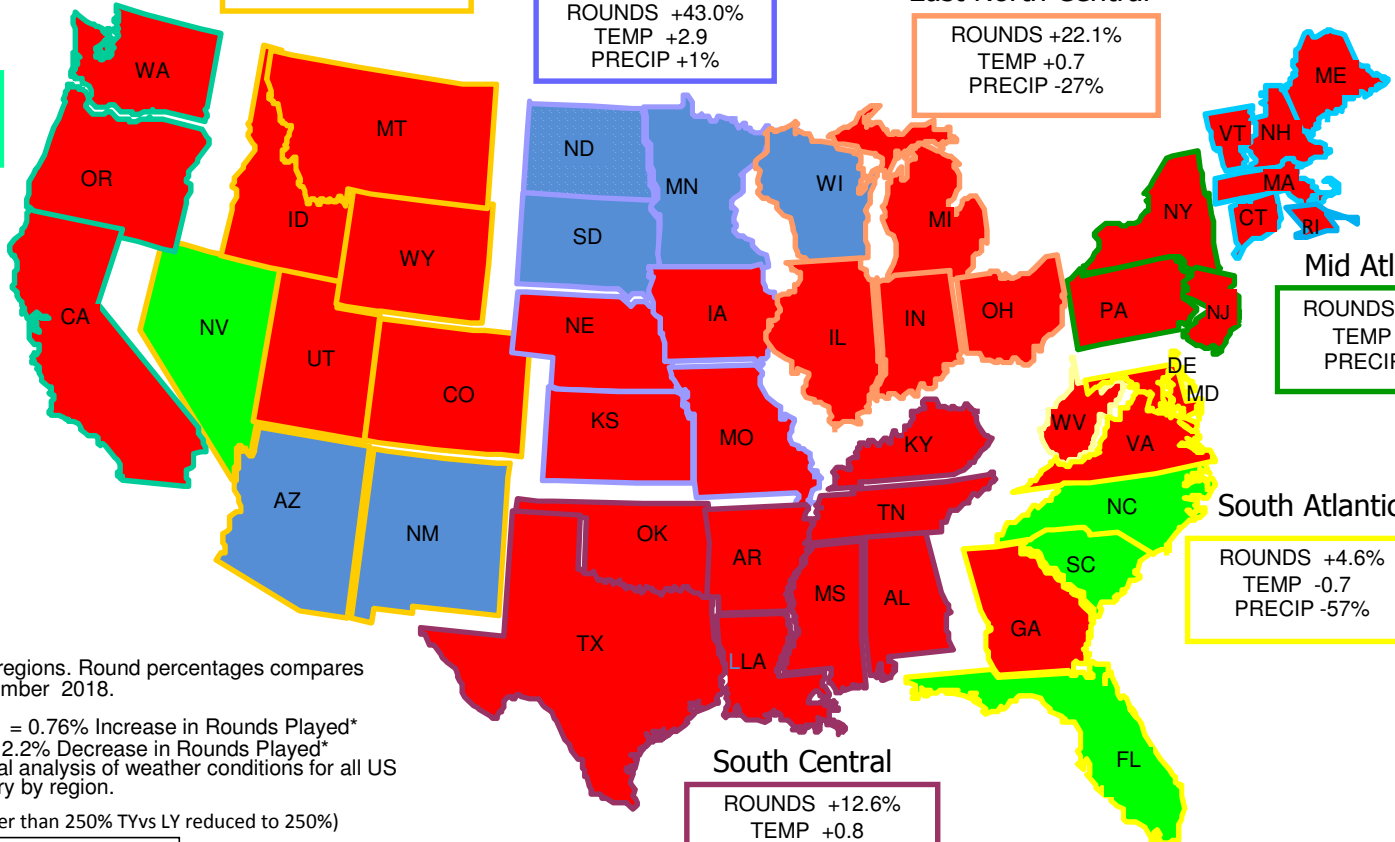

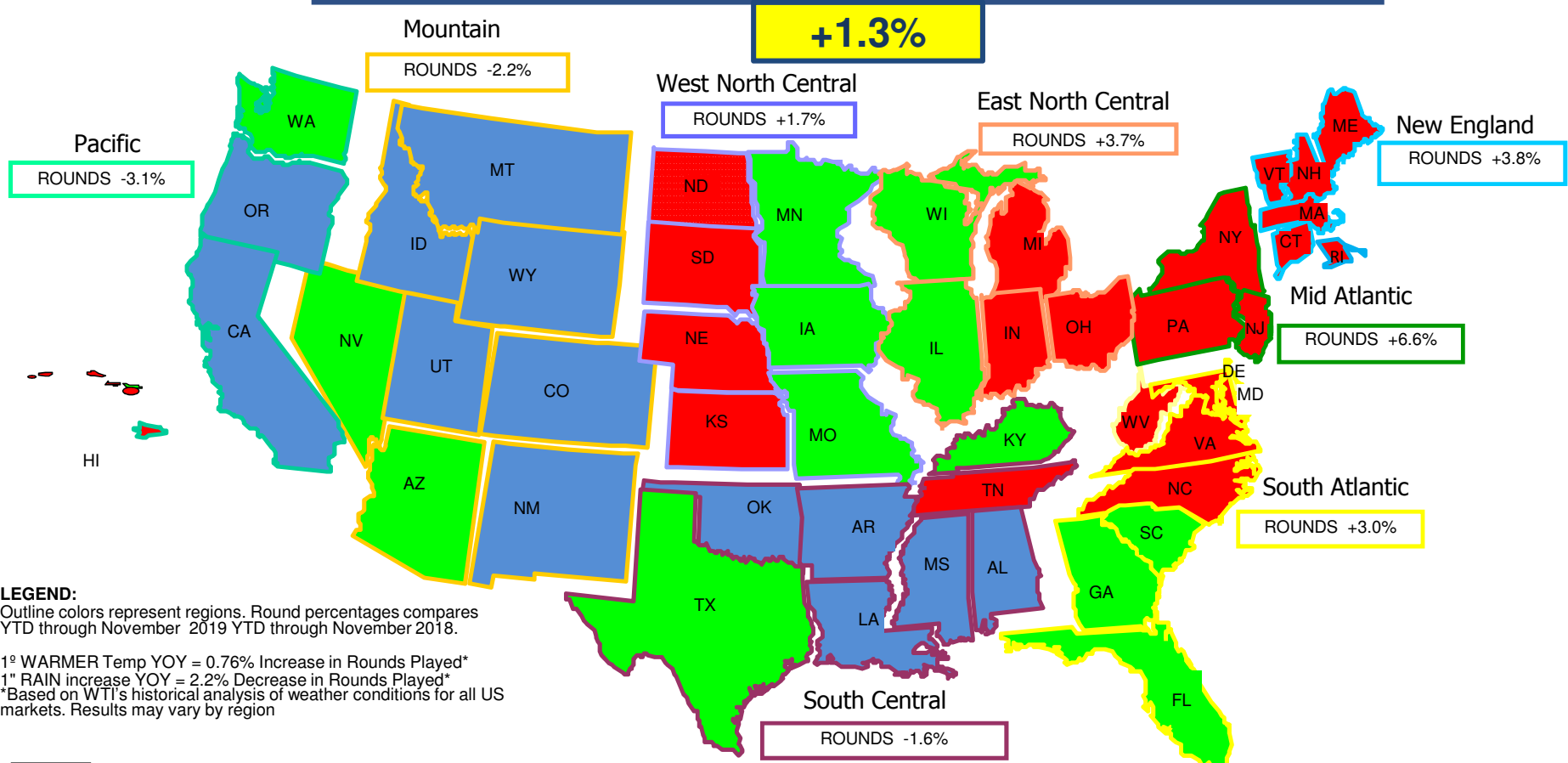
